he Provincial games also included games that are not physical, games of the mind. The District won first positions in both Mlabalaba and Chess.

Mlabalaba is the isiZulu name for Morabaraba, a traditional two-player strategy board game in South Africa. Sometimes they call the game Zulu Chess.

The game was historically used to teach strategy and continues to be popular today.

Ms Sindi Ngcobo from
Appelsbosch Hospital won the
first position for uMlabalaba in the
female category. She proved that
females can also be good at
board games when she also
snatched the second position in
chess.

Mr Mfundo Ndlovu from Richmond Hospital was the overall winner in the Chess male category. Both the winners showed strength in planning and execution, as both Mlabalaba and chess are mind games. They require strategy, problem-solving, and pattern recognition. Players must think ahead, anticipate their opponent's moves.
