# Brakvaal Primary school activation

## Tuesday 16 September 2014

**B**rakvaal Primary school activation took place on Tuesday 16 September 2014. There was no activation mobile truck and the principal agreed to use school hall as a venue for activation. Even if the truck was available we wouldn't be able to use it because of very strong winds.

There were no services like health screening at the school. The school has 104 learners and it was identified by Ms Lungile Maphalala, PHC Manager for Uthukela District. During

this activation I gave TB education to learners and Ms Lindiwe Nyembe gave education on HIV. We asked learners question and gave out prizes (rulers, T-shirts, jackets and squeeze bottles) provided by Mr Legoabe from URC.

On the same day there was meeting for parents and school governing body and we took an opportunity to distribute pamphlets and smart cards on TB.

I also gave out TB posters on infection control

KZN Department of Health provided their loud hailing equipment and sedan car to assist with conveying message to community members especially those who didn't come to testing station.

Health screening and testing was provided while Ms Sindy Shabalala, Mr Thabo Sithole and Mr Bonga Hlomuka were loud-hailing. During loud hailing exercise, infor-

mation on TB, HIV, MMC etc was shared. Condoms and promotional material provided by URC were also distributed to draw people to testing station.

Partners who were there include Duduza, LGBTI., HTS and Mpilonhle .

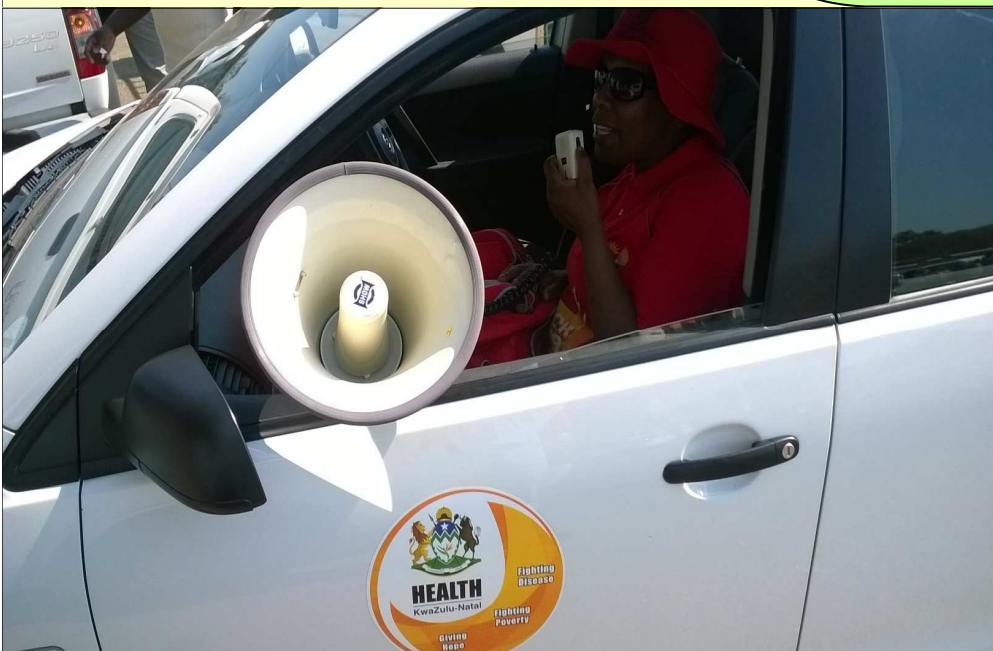

**O**n the 18th of September, Kick TB was suppose to take place in two schools but one principal apologized stating that learners are writing ANA examinations.

The second activation took place in Rantjiesvlakte Primary School. Again, there were very strong winds and dust. Even if kick TB truck was available we wouldn't be able to activate outside.

The school has 147 learners. The principal gave us school hall to conduct activation. Sindy Shabalala and other health professionals gave learners information on TB, HIV and Infection Control. Learners were asked questions and again prizes were given to learners and they were so happy to be visited by Kick TB team.

There was no provision of health services at the school. Health services team was working in Van Reenen Township providing health services and loud hailing.

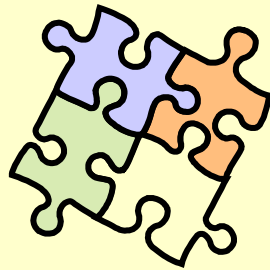

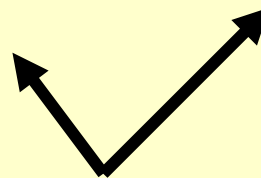
Approximately **1700** people received messages on all health topics covered by health professionals.

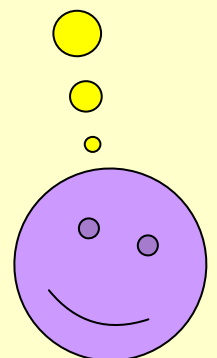

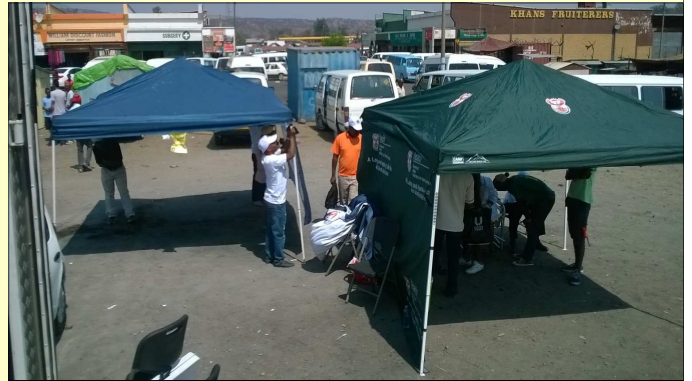


# Mackson Taxi Rank Activation
